


MARK PISCITELLI

While at Mynderse Academy, Mark lettered in three sports, Football, Basketball, and Baseball.

Mark was named to the 1968 All-American High School Football Team as a Running Back. He was also chosen to the All-State Team; Section V Team; and Greater Rochester Team his Junior and Senior Years. He credits his team and George Davis for any success he enjoyed while playing football. George Davis was instrumental in Mark's development as a Running Back and overall training. In addition to playing Safety on Defense, Mark also carried the ball 51 times in one game. His Junior and Senior Years, he rushed for over 1,300yds and 1,200yds respectfully.

Mark lettered in Varsity Baseball all four years. He had the highest batting average his Sophomore, Junior, and Senior Years with a .356; .430; and .465 respectively. He was named Most Valuable Player his Junior and Senior years.

Mark was a member of the 1964-65 undefeated (14-0) St. Patrick's CYO Basketball Team.

He was the recipient of the SMS Aldo Beatini Award for the Outstanding Mynderse Academy Athlete, as well as receiving the 1st St. Patrick's Alumni Award.

Also while at Mynderse, Mark was a High Honor Roll Student, member of the Student Council, Student of the Month, and a member of Block M.

Mark was recruited by several Division I colleges, and chose Cornell University. While at Cornell, Mark lettered in Freshman Baseball and Varsity Football. He was a member of the 1971 Cornell Ivy League Co-Championship Football Team. In

1970, he was among the nation's leaders in kickoff returns. A shoulder injury shortened his football career his Junior year.

Upon graduation from Cornell, Mark joined Carnation Co. in Long Island. He held various Mgmt. positions with Carnation/Nestle USA in Philadelphia, Albany and Syracuse, eventually becoming Director of Nestle USA's Retail Sales for the Northeast Division. In 2009, he retired from Nestle after a career of 35 years.

Mark considers himself very fortunate to have grown up in Seneca Falls. He is very appreciative of the support he received from his family, friends and numerous volunteers in the Seneca Falls community during his childhood.

Mark lives in Baldwinsville, NY with his wife, Ginny. They have two daughters, Jennifer and Jessica.
