Mynderse Academy's storied athletic history produced many outstanding student athletes and Domenic Caraccilo is no exception, excelling in both football and baseball. Domenic's athletic accomplishments came in the era of the 1950's when there were many outstanding multi-sport athletes both at Mynderse Academy and throughout the Central New York area.

A member of the Varsity Football team at Mynderse Academy for four years as a running back, Domenic led the team in many categories and was instrumental in the success of the team. During his senior year, Domenic was one of the team's co-captains. He scored 19 touchdowns, was selected as the team's Most Valuable Player, was elected to the Tri-County All-Star team and was selected to the Syracuse Herald Journal All-State Team as the Outstanding Player of the year.

Domenic was a member of the Varsity Baseball team for four years and was the team's catcher. He batted .350 his senior year, leading the team to the League Championship and the first Section V Championship in school history.

Upon graduation, Domenic went to Morrisville State College where he played football and baseball. He earned Most Valuable Player award in both sports and still has the highest batting average in school history with a .680 average. In 2000 Domenic was elected to the Morrisville State College Wall of Fame.

While attending Mynderse Academy, Domenic also played Varsity Basketball. His senior year he was selected as President of the school's Athletic Association, was a class officer and served as President of the Student Council.

Domenic is a life-long resident of Seneca Falls where he lives with his wife, Kay. He and Kay are the proud parents of daughters, Cathy, Carla, Ann and Nancy. He is

retired from Gould Pumps where he was employed for 40+ years. Domenic has been involved in many community and student activities as he coached Junior League Football for six years, Little League Baseball for four years and worked at the Seneca Falls Recreation Center for four years. He also served his community as Town Councilman and served on the Town's Board of Appeals.
